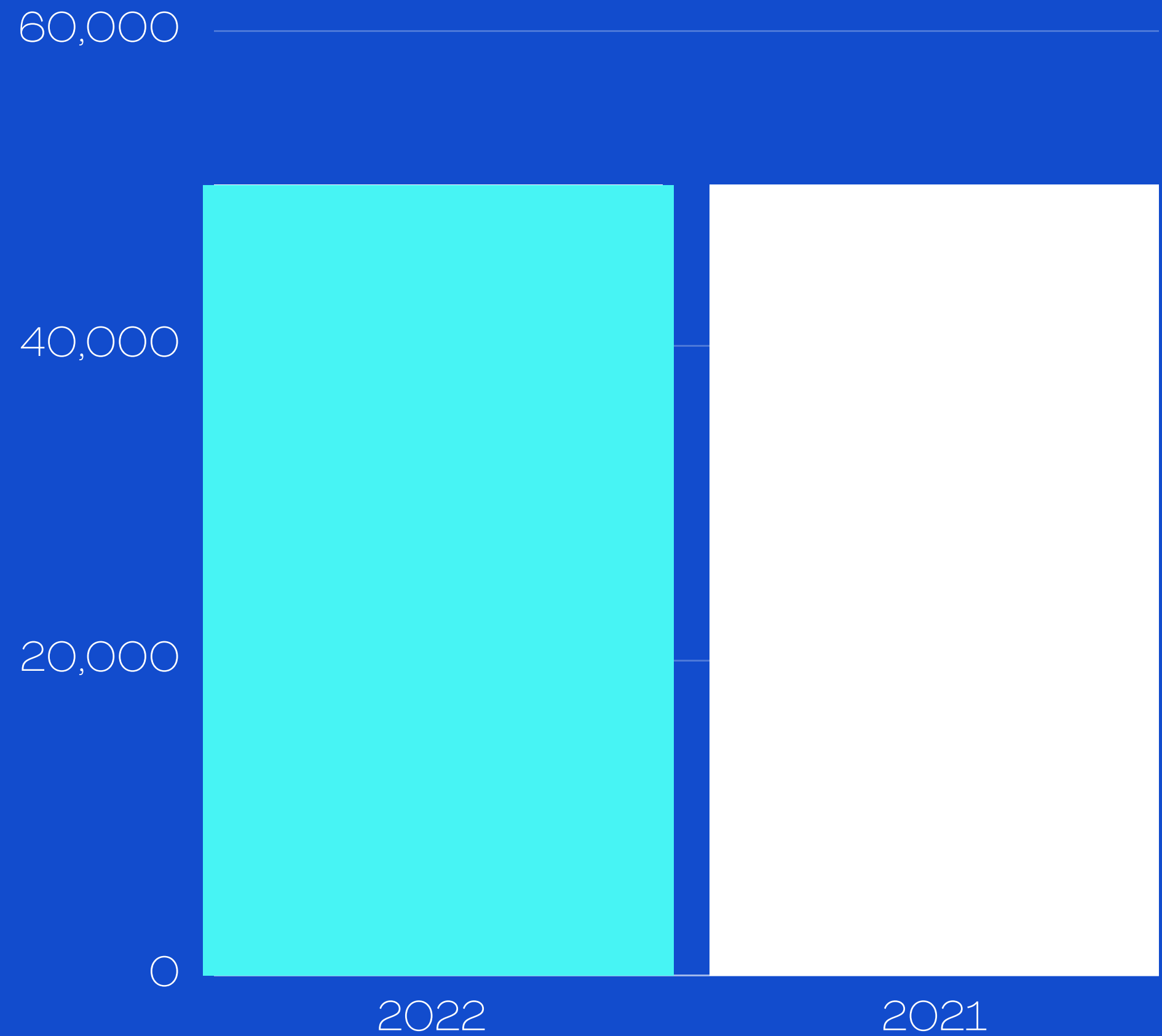

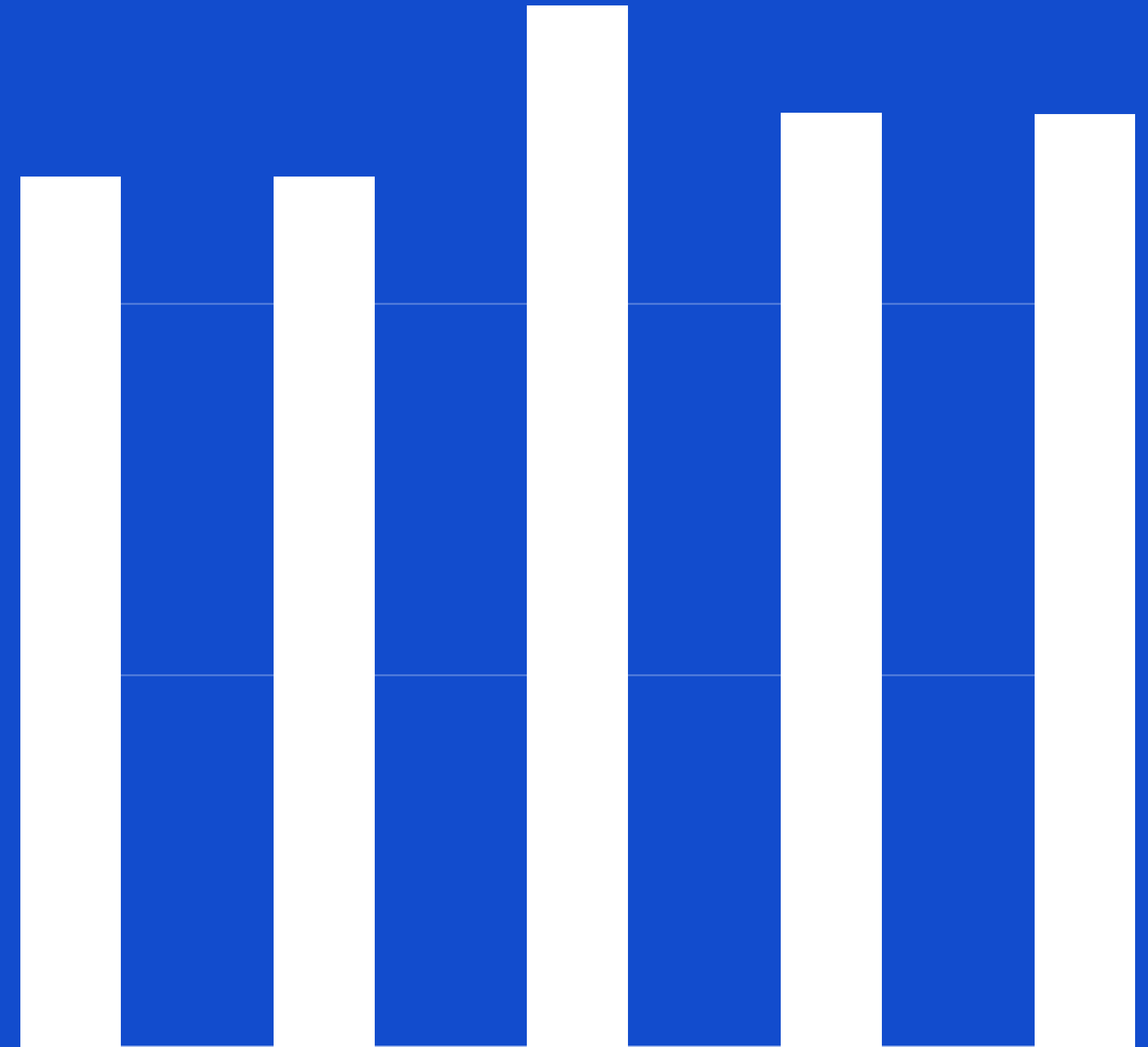

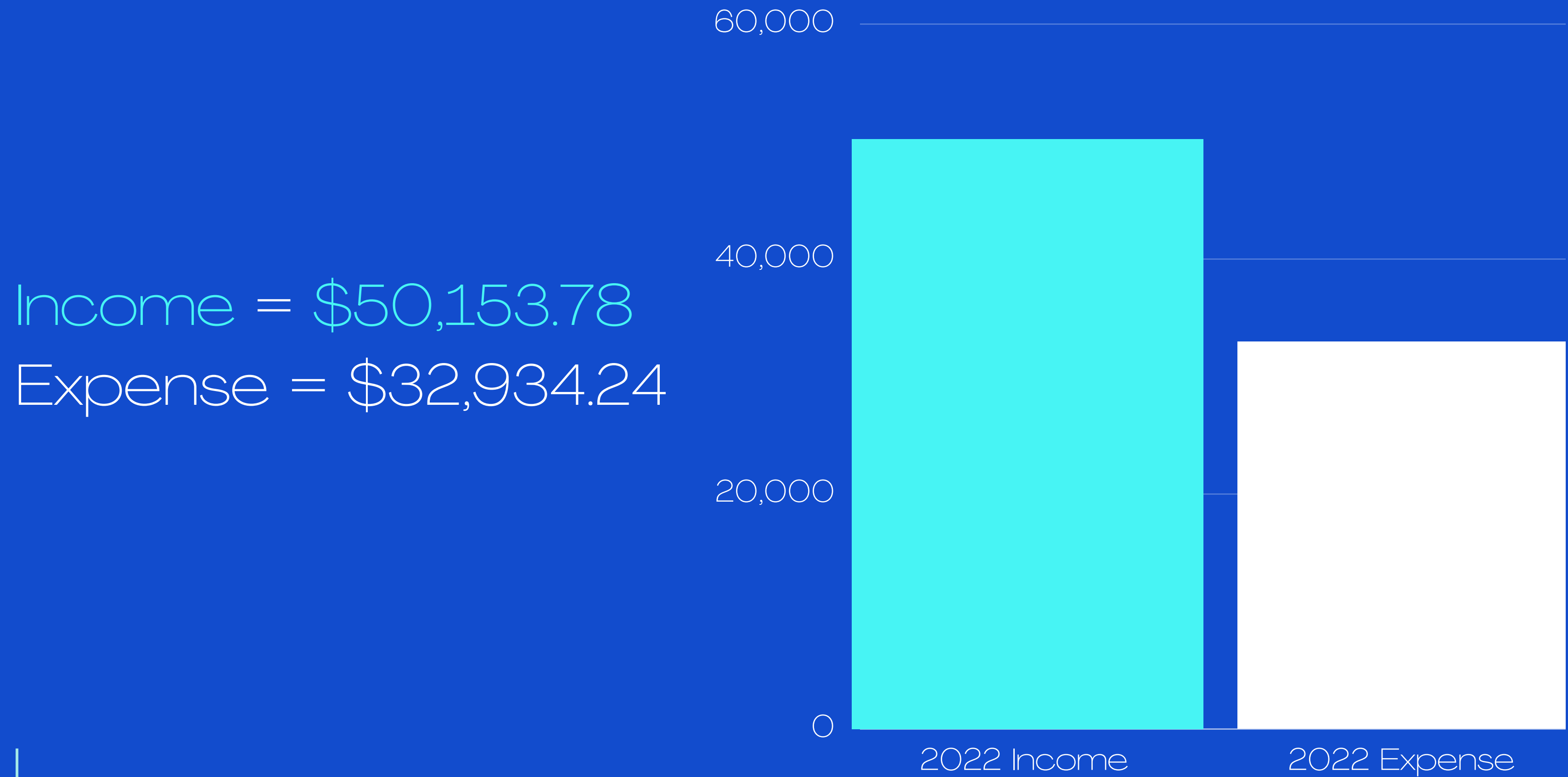

- Fed 1st Responders (Snellville Fire Station 12) and Nicholas House Homeless Shelter for Thanksgiving
- Provided 200 Back-to-School supplies to Care4 All Children Services, Nicholas House homeless Shelter, Bethel Family Christian Church, and Victory Baptist Church.
- Held fundraiser (Back-to-School, shelter feedings, Adopt-A – Family). Raised \$6,940
- Hosted COVID Adopt-A-Family Program. Prepared for 35 families and 91 children. Families received Kroger and Publix gift cards, Bibles, non-perishables and produce boxes. Family referrals were obtained from Bethel Baptist, Care4 All Children Services (Foster Care), Rockdale Division of Family, Antioch AME Church and a host of friends and WOC volunteers.
- From October – December, tutoring sessions are held each Saturday. WOC recruited ten high school students who provided tutoring services to children K–8th grade who reside in foster care with Care4 All Children Services.
- Provided tutoring services from October through December 2022 to children within Care4 All Children Services and general public.

- Received \$50,153 in monetary contributions.
- Received \$8,400 in grant funding from Walton EMC Trust
- Received 30 produce boxes from Berean Christian Church
- Received 75 bags of non-perishables from Margie's House
- Provided \$6,000 for Annual Scholarship Program (6 students)
- Received \$500 grant from Constellation Gas as Community Champion Award
- The 5-year comparison shows funding from \$35,675.22 (2018) to \$50,153.78 (2022).

The ministry continues to grow financially; as such, activities for 2022 will continue to be based on an expected increase in revenue and moderate COVID restrictions.

WOC Scholarships are designed to provide annual financial assistance to outstanding high school seniors who plan to attend an accredited 4-year college or university of their choice and those who plan to enroll in ROTC courses. Through its scholarship funds, WOC provided six students with \$1,000 financial assistance to the outstanding male and/or female African-American students residing in the United States who plan to attend an accredited four-year college or university of their choice within the United States.

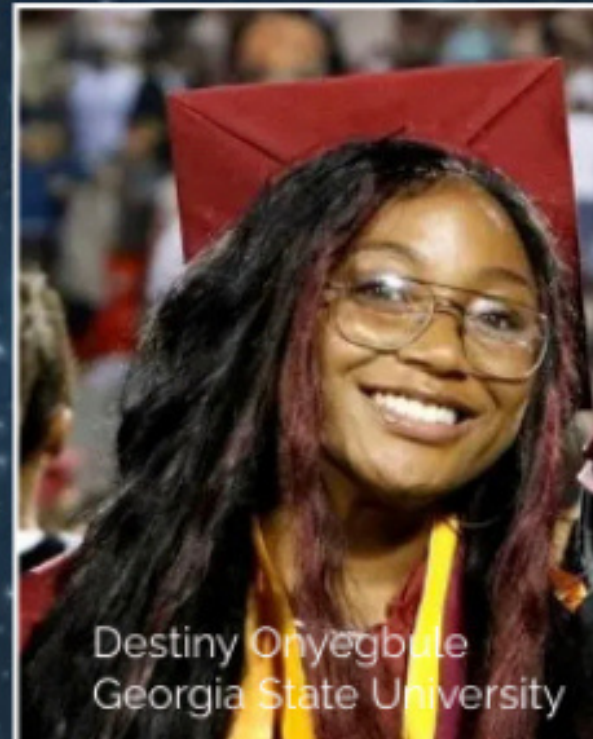

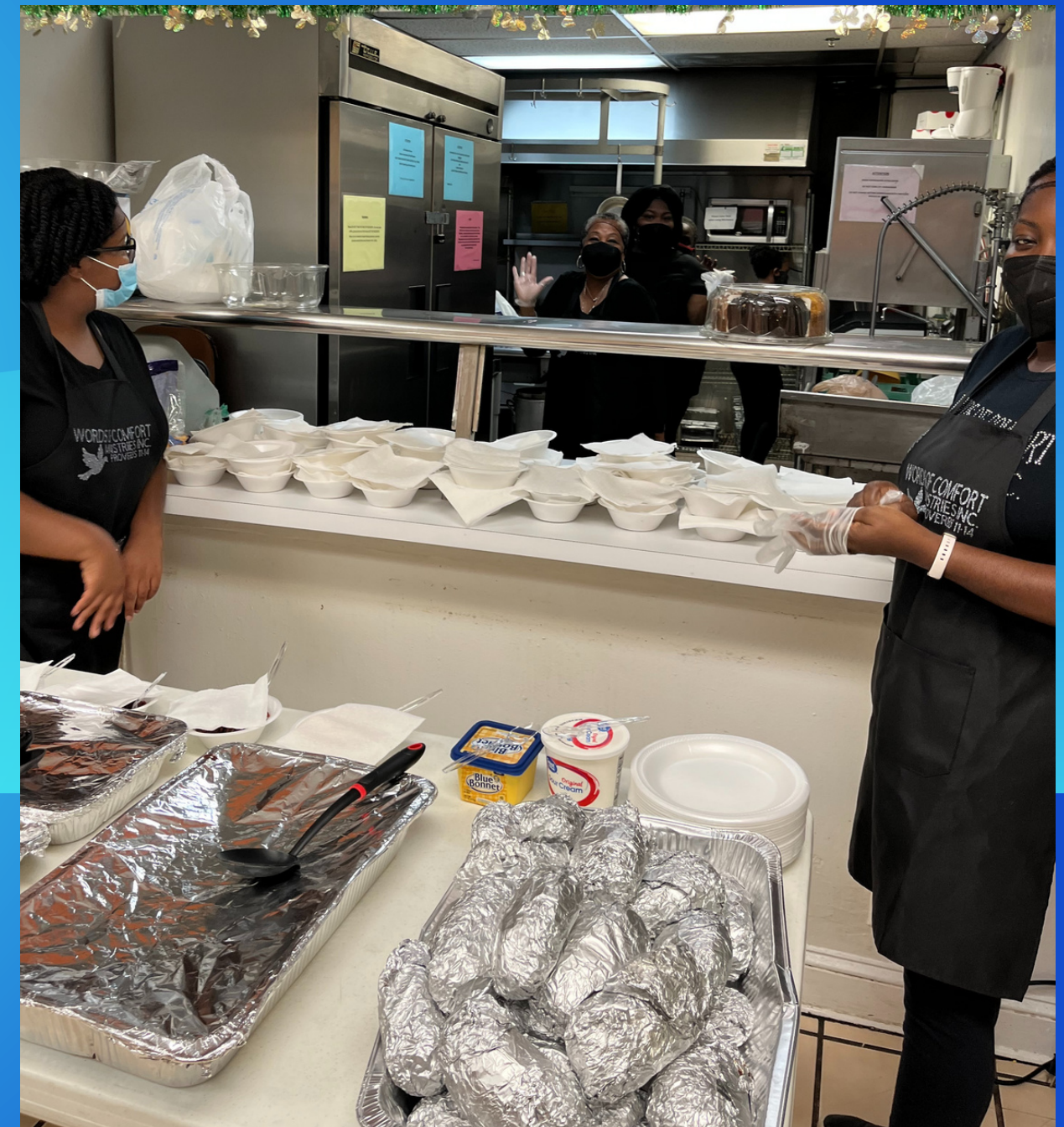
